6) Do you like the park? Why or why not? Explain your answer below.

Answers and Explanations

1) C

Core Standard: **Key Ideas and Details**

In the first paragraph of the passage, the author writes, “I slide.” This lets us know that the author is playing at the park. In addition, the author mentions “Jack” and “Ashley” in the next two parts of the passage. If we count the author, Jack, and Ashley, this lets us know that there are three people playing at the park. Therefore **(C)** is correct.

The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** and **(B)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

2) A

Core Standard: **Integration of Knowledge**

In the fourth paragraph of the passage, the author writes, “We run.” In the fifth part of the passage, the author writes, “We play.” We know that they do these things at the park. Playing tag is a game that involves running and playing. This lets us know that if the kids can run and play at the park, the friends might also play tag at the park. Therefore **(A)** is correct.

The passage does not provide information to support choices **(B)** or **(C)**. Because these things typically take place inside, and the park is outside, we can tell that they are incorrect.

3) B

Core Standard: **Key Ideas and Details**

In the third paragraph of this passage, the author writes, “Ashley climbs.” This lets us know that at the park, Ashley climbs. Therefore **(B)** is correct.

The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(C)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

4) A

Core Standard: **Integration of Knowledge**

In the first paragraph of this passage, the author writes, “I slide. I go down the slide. I go up the slide.” This lets us know that the person who wrote this passage is playing at the park. Since younger people usually play at a park, we can tell that this passage was probably written by William, a student. This means **(A)** is correct.

Police officers do not usually play at the park. Since they are more likely to patrol than play, we can tell that this passage was probably not written by Connie, a police officer. Therefore **(B)** is incorrect.

Teachers do not usually play at the park. They may supervise students at a park, but they do not typically play there. This lets us know that this passage was probably not written by Mr. Brown, a teacher. This means **(C)** is incorrect.

5) C

Core Standard: **Key Ideas and Details**

In the fifth paragraph of this passage, the author writes, “We play all day at the park.” This lets us know that the friends play at the park all day long. Therefore **(C)** is correct.

The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(B)**. Therefore they are incorrect.
