## **Answers and Explanations**

**1)** B

Core Standard: Key Ideas and Details

In paragraph 1, the story says, "Machines need gasoline to work." Choice (B) is correct.

**2)** A

Core Standard: Key Ideas and Details

The story says, "Airplanes need gas. Without gas, they can't fly." This must mean that gas helps airplanes fly. Therefore, choice (A) is correct.

**3)** A

Core Standard: Integration of Knowledge

The story says, "Cars and buses need gas. [...] Airplanes need gas. [...] Other machines like lawn mowers and farm tools also need gas." Cars, buses, airplanes, mowers, and farm tools need gas because they are machines. Since buses are mentioned as machines, choice (A) is correct.

**4)** C

Core Standard: Integration of Knowledge

The story says, "Cars and buses need gas. [...] Airplanes need gas. [...] Other machines like lawn mowers and farm tools also need gas." Cars, buses, airplanes, mowers, and farm tools need gas because they are machines. Cats are not mentioned as machines, but cars and airplanes are. Cats are living creatures. Therefore, choice **(C)** is correct.
