# Amos Makes a Cake

My name is Amos. I am baking a cake. Here's how I do it.

First, I put flour in a bowl. Then I add some sugar and a little bit of salt to the bowl. Then I crack some eggs into the bowl.

I mix it all together. It looks dry in the bowl, so I mix in some milk. Now it looks better.

I put the cake mix in a baking pan, and then I put the pan in the oven.

I laugh, too. I turn on the oven.

We wait together for the cake to be ready.

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## **Answers and Explanations**

#### **1)** A

Core Standard: Key Ideas and Details

In the beginning of the passage it says, "My name is Amos. I am baking a cake." Choice (A) is correct.

## **2)** B

Core Standard: Key Ideas and Details

In the beginning of the passage Amos says, "First, I put flour in a bowl." Choice (B) is correct.

### **3)** A

Core Standard: Key Ideas and Details

At the end of the passage, it says, "Something looks wrong: the cake is not baking." Choice (A) is correct.

### **4)** B

Core Standard: Key Ideas and Details

Near the end of the passage, we learn that the cake is not baking. Amos calls his mom for help. She tells him that he forgot to turn on the oven. This lets us know that choice **(B)** is correct.

## **5)** B

Core Standard: Integration of Knowledge

In the end of the passage, Amos fixes his problem by turning on the oven. He laughs and waits for his cake to be ready. This lets us know that Amos feels happy in the end. Choice **(B)** is correct.
